ARKANSAS REQUIRED IMMUNIZATION RECORDS

Welcome to the University of Arkansas! The Pat Walker Health Center (PWHC) provides students with medical and mental health services.

The State of Arkansas requires that all newly admitted U of A students comply with the two-dose measles Immunization Policy. Follow these instructions.

Please read carefully: Failure to complete as instructed could result in class registration delays.

<u>**Part 1 is mandatory for all students.**</u> Send immunization documents directly to the Pat Walker Health Center per the information below. Please do not send immunization documents with materials being sent to other university departments.

Part 1Measles, Mumps, RubellaRequired for all Students.As stated above, you must comply with the State of Arkansas two-dose measles Immunization Policy. If a second
immunization is needed, it must be the combined MMR vaccine.

<u>REQUIRED</u>: (one of the following three options is required to fulfill Part 1):

• First Option: 2 doses of MMR vaccine.

Obtain copies of your immunization records (see acceptable sources below) and submit as above. <u>Students should retain original documents</u>. Copies of immunization records will be retained by Pat Walker Health Center after entry into the University database.

How to obtain your immunization records:

- Locate copies of your personal immunization records ("baby book").
- Call your physician's office and inquire about your immunization records.
- Call your local Health Department and inquire about your immunization records.
- Call your high school or previous college to inquire about your immunization records. (Note: Transcripts from other institutions which are sent to another office at the U of A are not forwarded to PWHC. You will still need to provide us with this documentation).
- <u>Second Option: Titer (Blood test) results</u> proving immunity to measles (rubeola), mumps and rubella. Documentation is required.

REQUIRED: (continued):

• <u>Third Option: Exemption</u>:

1. Medical Exemption: The physical condition of the above-named person is such that MMR immunization would endanger life or health or is medically contraindicated due to other medical conditions.

2. Religious/Personal Exemptions: Only the Arkansas Department of Health can provide this exemption. The Department of Health can be contacted by calling (501) 661-2169 or healthy.arkansas.gov

Part 2	Tuberculosis (TB) Screening	Required for all students in any of the
		following categories.

You must comply with the State of Arkansas Tuberculosis Screening Requirement if:

- a) You were born outside the United States and not a permanent resident of the United States. Pat Walker Health Center will assist in 1) determining if you are required to participate in TB screening; 2) complying with the appropriate screening process.
- b) You have had any contact with a person with known active TB.

If a TB screening is required, this can be completed at the Pat Walker Health Center OR

Provide documentation of TB Screening done in the United States or Canada within the past 6 months. Chest x-rays will be required for anyone with a positive TB test. X-rays can be taken at the health center, or you may bring chest x-ray films taken within the last 6 months. <u>A negative chest x-ray is not a substitute for a TB test.</u>

OR

Provide documentation of prior treatment of active TB disease.

Failure to comply with this requirement may impact your student status.

Recommended Vaccination

Meningococcal Vaccine Arkansas Act 1233 of 1999 requires us to inform you of this rare, but potentially fatal, bacterial infection commonly referred to as meningitis. Students living in residence halls have a slightly higher risk of contracting this disease. The University of Arkansas recommends that all students living in residence halls or Greek housing receive at least one dose of the traditional meningitis vaccine (MCV4) on or after their 16th birthday and complete a separate vaccine series for serotype B. Both Meningococcal vaccines are available at the Pat Walker Health Center.
